

DOCUMENTARY HERITAGE COLLECTIONS
EDITED BY THE INSTITUTE OF HISTORY FROM CLUJ (1920–2022)*

ELA COSMA**

Abstract

Founded 102 years ago, as the first Institute of National History in Romania (1920), over time affiliated to the Cluj University and to the Romanian Academy, the current Institute of History – “George Barițiu” – in Cluj-Napoca had a major objective, pursued with obstination since its foundation until today, in spite of the political regimes and ideological dictatorships interfering with its century-long existence.

Its aim is no other than safeguarding and capitalizing the Romanian, Central and Southeast European documentary heritage. The method chosen in order to achieve this goal is editing documents of medieval, premodern, modern, and contemporary history. The exceptional human capital, which the History Institute from Cluj knew how to cultivate from generation to generation, has produced the experts needed, especially, in Latin and Romanian, Hungarian, and German palaeographies.

The scientific results are reflected in research and publications counting more than 100 critical editions of documents and over 80 monographs and volumes of studies with document annexes, published in not less than 22 collections, edited by the History Institute in Cluj, which are presented in our study.

Founded in 1920, 101 years ago, as the first Institute of National History in Romania, over time affiliated to the Cluj University for 42 years (between 1920–1948 and 1975–1989) and to the Romanian Academy for 59 years (between 1948–1975 and 1990–2021),¹ the current Institute of History – “George Barițiu” –

in Cluj-Napoca had a major objective, pursued with obstination since its foundation until today, in spite of the political regimes and ideological dictatorships interfering with its century-long existence.

Its aim is no other than safeguarding and capitalizing the documentary heritage at a local (Transylvanian), national (Romanian), and international (Central and Southeast European) level. The method chosen in order to achieve this goal is editing documents of medieval, premodern, modern and contemporary history.

The exceptional human capital, which the History Institute from Cluj knew how to cultivate from generation to generation, has produced the experts needed, especially, in Latin and Romanian, Hungarian and German palaeographies. Some 250 researchers were employed by the Institute over its 100 years of history, according to the assessment of our institution's director Ioan Bolovan,² which means that the modest annual average number of only 20 researchers working here shows that, even if the Cluj History Institute is a small institution compared to other Romanian Academy institutes, its scientific results reflected in research and publications are among the highest and most valuable.

From the moment it was founded by Royal Decree, on 1 February 1920, within the frame of the Faculty of Letters of "King Ferdinand I" Romanian University in Cluj,³ the Institute of National History specified its mission, which was to coordinate a coherent scientific research program of studies regarding the past of the Transylvanian Romanians, which had been poorly and unilaterally performed before the Great Union of 1 December 1918. In order to fulfill this mission, the first two Institute directors Ioan Lupaş and Alexandru Lapedatu settled several directions and goals of the scientific activity. In fact, since autumn 1919 the Institute of National History had already established a program in 9 points, stipulating the very safeguarding of the documentary heritage, by using the

following methods: critical editing of historical documents, elaboration of collections both of primary and secondary sources. All these were clearly highlighted at points “1. Publication of the historical collections, appreciated as fundamental in reaching the proposed goals”; “3. Editing of a year-book (*Anuar*), where researchers could present their contributions, and of further publications including genuine contributions and testimonies regarding the progress of the national historiography, especially with respect to the Romanians from former Hungary”; “4. Drawing a historical bibliography able to facilitate the researchers’ work”.⁴

The motivating impulse offered by the 9 points program issued by directors Ioan Lupaș and Alexandru Lapedatu, as well as the creative effervescence specific to the interwar period materialized in 11 tomes of “Anuarul Institutului de Istorie Națională” [Year-book of the Institute of National History] in Cluj, published during a quarter century between 1921/1922–1946/1947, and in 22 volumes of the collection *Biblioteca Institutului de Istorie Națională* [Library of the Institute of National History], published in mere two decades between 1928–1948.⁵

After the war and returning from the refuge in Sibiu to Cluj (1943–1945),⁶ the Institute of National History in Cluj left the patronage of the University “King Ferdinand I” (which was dissolved and reorganized as the University “Victor Babeș”). Instead it joined the new created Academy of the Popular Republic of Romania (that replaced the old Romanian Academy), but under a changed name as Institute of History and Philosophy of the Academy Branch of the Popular Republic of Romania in Cluj. This change was codified by the organizational act of 9 December 1948, which also stipulated professor dr. Constantin Daicoviciu taking the direction and including in the plan of institutional activities the initiation of a document collection from the period of the Transylvanian Principality (1570–1711), *Monumenta Comititalia Regni Transilvaniae*, planned in no less than 20 volumes (yet none of them was realized!), the documentation for Horea’s uprising of 1784 to be undertaken by David Prodan and the elaboration of several volumes

of studies and documents by Jakó Zsigmond, David Prodan, Ștefan Pascu (all the latter being completely fulfilled).

Under the difficult auspices of the so-called “obsessive decade” (Marin Preda) of Stalinist pattern in Romania, the ministerial decision no. 55937 from 25 February 1949 confirmed the “creation” of the Institute of History and Philosophy of the Academy of the Romanian Popular Republic in Cluj,⁷ while the council of ministers’ decision no. 529 from 15 April 1952 approved as definitive the transfer of the Institute of Philosophy and of the Institute of Linguistics in Cluj to the Academy of the Romanian Popular Republic.⁸

During the entire communist period, the Institute of History in Cluj was under two long lasting leaderships ensured by directors Constantin Daicoviciu (1949–1973) and Ștefan Pascu (1973–1989). The first reorganization of the Institute of History and Philosophy took place in 1949, when several sections were formed (“Romanian history” with... a Hungarian compartment, led by Ioan Moga; “History of the Slav people”, led by Mihail Dan; “Old general history”, led by Constantin Daicoviciu; “General history of the middle ages”, led by Ștefan Pascu; “Philosophy”, led by Pavel Apostol), and among them the section of “Archives and documents”, led by David Prodan, with its annexes at the Archive of the Transylvanian Museum and the State Archives in Cluj. Furthermore, the researchers were organised in 4 “collectives” (the document collective, the Hurmuzaki index collective, the bibliographic collective, the collective of the archaeological repertoire). In the same year 1949 an archive repository was set up at the Cluj Institute, by transfer or acquisition of medieval and modern documents from the Romanian Archives. The preparations also started for a collective volume of *Sources of Romania’s Modern and Contemporary history (1800–1900)* and for further document collections that later granted the Institute’s national and international acknowledgement.⁹

The collection of *Studii și documente privitoare la Revoluția românilor din Transilvania în anii 1848–1849* [Studies and Documents regarding the Revolution of the Transylvanian Romanians in the Years 1848–1849] successfully passed the caudine forks of the moment caused by the refuge to Sibiu of the Cluj Institute of History, as Silviu Dragomir managed to publish 3 of 4 volumes between 1944–1946. After 1945, the publications of the Institute suffered delays, cessation or unwanted transformations, because of the war and political situation. The instauration of the atheist regime of Soviet inspiration produced tragedies at the level of the Institute, too, as both of its first directors were arrested by the communists in 1950. Ioan Lupaș was released two years later and survived,

although deprived of rights, but Alexandru Lapedatu died in Sighet after 6 months of prison. The collection *Biblioteca Institutului de Istorie Națională* [Library of the Institute of National History] was abolished in 1948. In its last tome (XXII), David Prodan published his *Iobăgia pe Domeniul Băii de Arieș la 1770* [The Serfdom on the Dominion Baia de Arieș in 1770]. The new director Ioan Moga could not finish neither in 1946, nor in 1947, the publication of the yearbook as a volume, but only as excerpts from the studies of tome XI. In fact, since 1945 “Anuarul Institutului de Istorie Națională” [Yearbook of the Institute of National History] suspended its activity for ever. Instead there were issued the short-lived periodicals “Studii și Cercetări Științifice” [Scientific Studies and Research], 6 vol., between 1950–1955, “Studii și Cercetări de Istorie” [Studies and Research of History], 2 vol., between 1956–1957.¹⁰ However, during these years (between 1951–1955), the Institute of History in Cluj began the critical editing and publication of the first *corpus* of medieval documents, *Documente privind Istoria României. C. Transilvania* [DIR, Documents regarding the History of Romania. C. Transylvania], in 6 volumes.

At the end of the year 1953, another name change of the institution occurred and it became the Institute of History in Cluj, and in 1954 there was a reorganization in three sections: of old history, medieval history and modern history. Further reorganizations were undertaken later, like that of 1966, when the Institute had 2 sections (for archaeology and ancient history, and for the history of Romania) with 6 compartments (“primitive communal system and prefeudalism”, “slavagist system”, medieval history, auxiliary sciences, modern history, contemporary history).¹¹

The main periodical was renamed “Anuarul Institutului de Istorie din Cluj” [Yearbook of the Institute of History in Cluj] and it was reissued starting with the double number I–II for the years 1958–1959. Since then, the new series of the “Anuar” uninterruptedly continued to be published. Today, “Anuarul Institutului de Istorie «George Barițiu» din Cluj-Napoca” [Yearbook of the Institute of History “George Barițiu” in Cluj-Napoca], Series Historica, reached tome LX in 2021, being lately also accompanied by a few supplement numbers.

Then, in 1971, a new name was imposed to our institution. The Institute of History and Archaeology in Cluj left later, in 1975, the patronage of the Academy of the Romanian Socialist Republic (since 1965) and entered that of the just created Academy of Social and Political Sciences, the very forum organising the nation’s ideological re-education. It was a moment when the Institute, too, “felt a cold wind, a frozen Siberian one, we could say, blowing stronger and stronger” (Simion

Retegan). At the same time the Institute was transferred again to the University Babeş-Bolyai from Cluj for the next 15 years (between 1975–1989).¹²

After long preparations, the dream of Ioachim Crăciun eventually came true in 1970, with the publishing of the first volume of the collection *Bibliografia Istorică a României* [Historical Bibliography of Romania], 14 vol., 1970–2010. In the 70's the volumes of correspondence of *George Bariț și contemporanii săi* [George Bariț and His Contemporaries], 10 vol., 1973–2003 and *Vincentiu Babeș* (2 vol., 1976–1983) were initiated. In 1977 began the publication of the collections *Documenta Romaniae Historica. Seria C. Transilvania (DRH)* [Historical Documents of Romania. Series C. Transylvania], 7 vol., 1977–2014, *Documenta Romaniae Historica. Seria D. Relații între Țările Române* [Historical Documents of Romania. Series D. Relations between the Romanian Lands], 1 vol., 1977, *Documente privind revoluția de la 1848 în Țările Române. C. Transilvania* [Documents regarding the Revolution of 1848 in the Romanian Lands. C. Transylvania], 12 vol., 1977–2020. In the 80's *Izvoarele Răscoalei lui Horea*, seria A. *Diplomataria* [Sources of Horea's Uprising, Series A. Acts], 12 vol., 1982–2012, *Izvoarele Răscoalei lui Horea*, seria B. *Izvoare narative* [Sources of Horea's Uprising, Series B. Right after the anti-communist revolution of December 1989 the separation of the Institute's sections of archaeology and art history from the section of history took place. Concomitantly, the researchers militated for leaving the University tutelage and returning to the Academy. Law no. 207 of 3 March 1990 stipulated both the creation of the Institute of Archaeology and Art History, and the transfer of several research institutes, among which the Institute of History and the Institute of Archaeology in Cluj, from the Ministry of Education to the Romanian Academy (renamed with its first name, after the dissolution of the Academy of the Socialist Republic of Romania in December 1989). After the resignation of director Ștefan Pascu on 28 December 1989, the general assembly of the Institute of 19 March 1990 chose by secret ballot director Aurel Răduțiu.¹³ We quote from *Dicționarul Membrilor Institutului de Istorie din Cluj (1920–2020)* [Dictionary of the Members of the Institute of History in Cluj (1920–2020)]: “Aurel Răduțiu was the only director of the Institute chosen by secret ballot by his colleagues immediately after the fall of the communist regime, which shows their confidence and reverence, as they considered him worthy to hold office in such troubled times of changes and readjustments”.¹⁴

During the post-communist period, our Institute was run by 4 directors: Aurel Răduțiu (1990–1995), Camil Mureșanu (1995–2007), Nicolae Edroiu (2007–2018) and Ioan Bolovan (since June 2018). From the perspective of the here debated topic, the quoted dictionary characterizes the accomplishments of the first three post-revolutionary directors as follows: Aurel Răduțiu “has appreciated in his whole career the historical document, which he put always forward and considered as a starting point for research”; Camil Mureșanu “has first of all sustained in his management activity the projects targeting the critical publication of the historical sources, giving priority to the medievalist and modern history studies”; while Nicolae Edroiu “managed to ensure the almost complete continuity of all document collections pending the palaeographic and diplomatic tradition of the Institute”¹⁵ (excepting only *Bibliografia istorică a României*).

The last decade of the past century brought in foreground projects prepared during the previous years that were now finally accepted for publication, such as the collection regarding *Mișcarea națională a românilor din Transilvania între 1849–1918* [The National Movement of the Romanians in Transylvania between 1849–1918], 8 vol., 1996–2019, or authored monographs that reopened *Biblioteca Institutului de Istorie. Serie nouă* [Library of the Institute of History. New Series], 10 vol., 1994–2008.

In 2000 the Institute of History in Cluj became an institution organizing doctorates (IOD) within the frame of the Romanian Academy, with 12 doctoral coordinators from among the researchers (Susana Andea, Iosif Marin Balog, Remus Câmpeanu, Ioan Chindriș, Nicolae Edroiu, Gheorghe Iancu, Stelian Mândruț, Camil Mureșanu, Lucian Nastasă-Kovács, Gelu Neamțu, Simion Retegan, Dumitru Suci) and over 110 doctoral theses defended until today, which also explains the initiation of a collection of *Teze de doctorat* [Doctoral Theses] published under the aegis of our Institute.¹⁶

By government decision no. 3 of 24 January 2002, the Center for Social Studies and Humanities in Cluj-Napoca, founded in 1968, merged with the Institute of History under the generic name of the “George Barițiu” Institute of History of the Romanian Academy.¹⁷ The assignment of the Institute’s patron in the personality of George Barițiu (1812–1893), a proposal sustained by director Camil Mureșan and voted out of 3 proposals, was adopted by the general assembly of the Institute members at the beginning of the same year 2002.

It was the time of extensive editorial accomplishments and publicistic achievements, as should be considered the publication between 2009 and 2016 of the 5 massive volumes of *Conscripția fiscală a Transilvaniei din anul 1750* [The

Fiscal Conscription of Transylvania from the Year 1750], 5008 pages. At the same time there were published the volumes of post-1848 documents regarding the Romanian Orthodox and Greek-Catholic churches, a sensitive topic, previously avoided both by censorship and editors (5 vol., 2011–2014). The collections of studies and monographs *Biografii istorice transilvane* [Transylvanian Historical Biographies], with tome 0 in 2006, tome I in 2008, reaching tome XVII in 2021, and *Teze de doctorat* [Doctoral Theses], 27 vol., 2010–2020 had a quick start, too. There was also an intensive preoccupation for preparing: works on the history of the Cluj Institute of History and the bibliography of the papers written by its members (3 vol., 2008–2011), useful working tools like the glossaries of medieval Latin (2 vol., 2003–2010), original topics like document editing of the freemasonry from Transylvania, Banat, Hungary between 1867–1918 (2 vol., 2011–2012).

The opening word, delivered on 2 June 2010 by director Nicolae Edroiu at the Scientific Symposium “90 Years of Existence of the Institute of History in Cluj. 1920–2010. The Place of the Institute in the Historical Research in România”, highlights the main aspect defining *Contribuția Institutului de Istorie din Cluj la publicarea izvoarelor istorice* [The Contribution of the Institute of History in Cluj to the Historical Sources Publishing]. Being the oldest research institute in the field of historical sciences from our country, the Cluj History Institute includes first and foremost, as “main tasks” (*sarcini de căpătâi*), but also as indicators of its scientific assessment, “researching the archives and libraries inside and outside the country, and publishing the historical sources”. Corresponding member of the Romanian Academy Nicolae Edroiu shows that exploiting the document heritage was, sometimes, a refuge in front of the “terror of history” (Mircea Eliade), but it remained until today a constant, that is responsibly and consciously assumed by our historical research: “After 1949, when the ideologization of the historiography in Romania was forcedly put forward, most of the historians took refuge to the collectives of editing historical documents, thus surviving to the political pressure of the time. Nowadays we deliberately carry on an old research direction of the Transylvanian Romanian historiography, following to lay a solid document foundation for further historical reconstitutions.”¹⁸

Nicolae Edroiu also invokes, among others, the historian’s mission to discover and study the sources of the past, recalling arguments featured by George Barițiu, founding member of the Romanian Academic Society and patron of the Academy History Institute in Cluj, both in 1845, in an article published in “Foaie pentru minte, inimă și literatură” [Pages for Mind, Heart and Literature], year VIII, no. 49, p. 389, and in 1870, quoting article IV, lit. B from *Statutul Societății Academice Române* [Status of the Romanian Academic Society]: “The History Section collects all important documents from the Romanian Lands or from abroad touching the history of Romanians; it organizes missions for such enterprises; initiates the exploration of the Romanian Lands from archaeological point of view; organizes competitions and awards the historical works proper to be popularized among Romanians.”¹⁹

At the turn of the second and third decades of the current century, it seems that present and future belong to encyclopedic works. Both for the direction and for the members of the Institute “George Barițiu” in Cluj-Napoca it is a moment of retrospection offered by the centenary celebration of our institution (2020), in order to sum up the fruitful evolution and activity of our forerunners, experts in economic, political and military history, in cultural and church history, in historical demography and in various palaeographies. However, it is also a moment of reflection, in order to scrutinize the future and to determine the guidelines of the historical research. The current leadership of the History Institute of the Romanian Academy in Cluj, by the voice of its director Ioan Bolovan, is laying out an unprecedented strategy, pragmatically anchored in *hic et nunc* and targeted towards tomorrow: *Scriem despre trecut, trăim în prezent, simțim viitorul* [We Write about the Past, We Live in the Present, We Feel the Future].²⁰ Our institution’s manager also organizes and sustains by all logistical means the macroscale process of elaboration of useful working tools, such as the prodigious *Dicționar al Membrilor Institutului de Istorie din Cluj (1920–2020)* [Dictionary of the Members of the Institute of History in Cluj (1920–2020)], published in 2020, or the new *Encyclopaedia of Romanian Historiography*, still in progress, which involves the intensive work of several researchers from our institution. As in the case of the document collections, the materialization of such projects takes long years of experience and dedicated efforts.

*

The results of such a Benedictine collective enterprise unfolded by the History Institute in Cluj for a century counts more than 100 critical editions of documents and over 80 monographs and volumes of studies with document annexes, published in not less than 22 collections.

Among them there are 11 collections of critically edited historical documents,²¹ 5 collections of historical studies and monographs with critical editions,²² 3 series of correspondence,²³ 2 series of historical bibliographies,²⁴ 1 collection of historical glossaries,²⁵ 2 volumes comprising the history of our institution, and 1 biobibliographic dictionary of the Institute's members, preceded by the institution's history.²⁶

From the collections to be shortly presented forwards we excluded the periodical publications of the Institute, the most significant among them being "Anuarul

Institutului de Istorie” [Yearbook of the Institute of History], published once a year, starting with the first number on 1921/1922 opened by the “Anuarul Institutului de Istorie Națională din Cluj” [Yearbook of the Institute of National History in Cluj],²⁷ and the “Buletinul informativ” [Newsletter] that has been issued twice a year, since 2018.²⁸

The 22 collections published by the History Institute in Cluj will be summarized onward, however not in chronological order of their publishing, but according to the chronology of their contents, that is according to the approached historical periods. We open the presentation with document collections and glossaries, we then proceed with the correspondence collections and bibliographies, and close with the collections of studies and monographs.

The members of the Institute’s collectives and sections dealing with processing of documents and bibliographies are not registered in alphabetical order either, as they gradually joined the editing and publishing activities, so the last mentioned will be the most recent to join among the co-editors and co-authors of the respective published collections.

1. *Documente privind Istoria României. C. Transilvania (DIR)* [Documents regarding the History of Romania. C. Transylvania], 6 vol., 1951–1955. The volumes elaborated by the collective section of medieval history²⁹ at the Institute of History and Philosophy in Cluj were published by Editura Academiei RPR (Publishing House of the Academy of the Romanian Popular Republic) in București. Coordinated by Mihail Roller, the volumes of this series involved a studious collective of experts, among which David Prodan deserves a special nominalization.

2. *Documenta Romaniae Historica. Seria C. Transilvania (DRH)* [Historical Documents of Romania. Series C. Transylvania], 7 vol., 1977–2014. The *DRH* collection included, from the beginning, great names among the volumes's coordinators (Mihai Berza, Constantin Cihodaru, Damaschin Mioc, Francisc Pall, Ștefan Pascu, Ștefan Ștefănescu, Ioan Caproșu, Leon Șimanschi, Aurel Răduțiu, Camil Mureșanu), and especially among its editors (Sabin Belu, Ioan Dani, Aurel Răduțiu, Viorica Pervain, Konrad G. Gündisch, Francisc Pall, Mihail Dan, Sigismund Jakó, Alexandru Neamțu, Theodor Naum, Ștefan Bezdechi, Iosif Pataki, Samuil Goldenberg, Adrian Rusu, Susana Andea, Lidia Gross, Adinel Ciprian Dincă).

3. *Documenta Romaniae Historica. Seria D. Relații între Țările Române* [Historical Documents of Romania. Series D. Relations between the Romanian Lands], 1 vol., 1977. This series comprises, unfortunately, a single volume, published concomitantly with tome X of *DRH. Seria C* and having the same editing collective formed of the Institute's members of the medieval history section.

4. Glossaries of medieval Latin, 3 vol., 1965–2010. In 1965, under the aegis of the Academy's Publishing House and of the General Direction of the State Archives in București, the *Glosarul de termeni și expresii din documentele latine privind Istoria medie a României* [Glossary of Terms and Phrases from Latin Documents regarding the Medieval History of Romania], written by the medieval history collective from our Institute, was issued in xerographic form, in a few copies. This working tool of major importance for the historians has, unfortunately, a very limited circulation, being destined for the strict use of the mediaevalist colleagues from the Institute and Archives, who own only 2 copies (!). That is why, its re-edition would be quite welcome.

Glosarul de latină medievală a documentelor care ilustrează istoria Transilvaniei [Glossary of the Documents illustrating the History of Transylvania], vol. I, fascicle I. *Lit. A-B* [Letters A-B], is signed by coordinators and authors Aurel

Răduțiu and Vasile Rus, by authors Susana Andea, Lidia Gross, Viorica Pervain, and by collaborators Anton Dörner, Beatrice Tătaru, Șerban Turcuș. The volume of almost 300 pages, published in 2003, is edited again in 2010, under the *Lit. A-C* [Letters A-C], in an augmented form of more than 700 pages, also including Latin documents from Moldavia and Wallachia.

5. *Conscripția fiscală a Transilvaniei din anul 1750* [The Fiscal Conscription of Transylvania from the Year 1750], 5 vol., 2009–2016. It is a premiere and an editorial achievement of exception in the Romanian area, very imposing by quantity and quality of the documentary approach. Volume 1. *Descrierea localităților* [Description of Localities], in 2 parts (tomes), counts 1,272+1,276 pages; volume 2. *Tabelele statistice* [Statistical Tables], formed of 3 parts, contains 671+1,056+733 pages. Thus, the integral edition of *Conscripția fiscală* (1750) totalizes 5,008 pagini. The success of this heavy professional, editorial and financial enterprise devolves upon the coordinator Ladislau Gyémánt, sustained by the small but vigorous team from the collective for the study of Horea's uprising,³⁰ made up of Remus Câmpeanu and Anton Dörner, accompanied by Florin Mureșan, from the Cluj County Direction of the National Archives in Cluj-Napoca, and by the publishing house Editura Enciclopedică from București.

6. *Izvoarele Răscoalei lui Horea*, seria A. *Diplomataria* [The Sources of Horea's Uprising, Series A. Acts], 12 vol., 1982–2012. The series *Diplomataria* of the collection *Izvoarele Răscoalei lui Horea* impresses with a great number of volumes published by the collective of premodern history from the Cluj Institute of History.³¹ Among the collection's coordinators, editors and collaborators we mention Ștefan Pascu, Alexandru Neamțu, Costin Feneșan, Cristina Feneșan, Lelia Täuber, Ion Dordea, Volker Wollmann, Mihai Cerghedean, Ladislau Gyémánt, Gheorghe Gorun, Remus Câmpeanu, Anton Dörner, Ion Mircea, Vasile Lechințan.

Eugen Hulea and Lazăr Nichi joined Silviu Dragomir as editors of the second volume.

9. *Documente privind revoluția de la 1848 în Țările Române. C. Transilvania* [Documents regarding the Revolution of 1848 in the Romanian Lands. C. Transylvania], 12 vol., 1977–2020. The volumes of the collection are edited by the collective for the study of the 1848 revolution from the Institute of History in Cluj.³² Over time, coordinators were Ștefan Pascu, Victor Chereșeșiu, Eged Ákos, Gelu Neamțu, collaborators Carl Göllner, G. Bözödi, Ileana Bozac, I. Kovács, Simion Retegan, Maria Maxim, J. Glück, Alexandru Neamțu, Ladislau Gyémánt, G. Kovács, Pompiliu Teodor, Ioan Chindriș, I. Dani. Last but not least, the editors of this long-lived collection were Benkő Samu, Liviu Botezan, Hilde Mureșanu, Károlyi Dénes, Eged Ákos, Kurt Schmidts, Gelu Neamțu, Ioan Bolovan, Marghioala Bodor, Stelian Mândruț, Ela Cosma, Attila Varga, Iosif Marin Balog. The last three mentioned are, at the same time, editors and coordinators of the last two published volumes (XI and XII).

10. Volumes of post-1848 church documents, 5 vol., 2011–2014. Even if they do not form a proper collection, the five volumes of church documents have at least two common denominators: their topic and the editors' team. The topic approaches the history based on documents of the Romanian Orthodox and Greek-Catholic churches during the modern age, after the revolutionary years of 1848–1849.

The coordinator Dumitru Suciu, sole author of 2 from 5 volumes, and editors Iosif Marin Balog, Loránd Mádly are researchers of the sector of modern history at our Institute, which thus realizes an excellent collaboration with professors from the Faculties of History and Orthodox Theology of the University Babeş-Bolyai: Alexandru Moraru, Diana Covaci, Vlad Popovici, Cosmin Cosmuța.

11. *Mișcarea națională a românilor din Transilvania între 1849–1918* [The National Movement of the Romanians from Transylvania between 1849–1918], 8 vol., 1996–2019. The collection, with an impossible and censored publishing before 1989, was initiated and coordinated by Simion Retegan and Dumitru Suciu. Its older collaborators were George Cipăianu, Rodica Sofronie, Maria Maxim, Marghioala Bodor, Kurt Schmidts, and its current editors are Mádly Loránd, Mirela Popa-Andrei, Daniela Deteșan, to whom Iosif Marin Balog will join at the next volume. The already published volumes of the collection include documents from the years 1849–1865 and are edited by the members of the homonym collective.³³

15. *Documenta Masonica* [1867–1918], 2 vol., 2011–2013. This collection of masonic documents from the Dual Monarchy is coordinated by Varga Attila. It was thought out on three levels, in order to exploit the historical archives of the masonic lodges from Transylvania and Banat (series I), Serbian Banat and Hungary (series II), in the period comprised between the second half of the 19th century and the end of the First World War. In each of the two series one volume has been published so far.

Between the years 1933–1946, Ioachim Crăciun had initiated and led another collection, *Bibliotheca Bibliologica* [Bibliological Library], publishing here 19 volumes,³⁵ but since the last mentioned series was undertaken under the umbrella of the University “King Ferdinand I”, we cannot include it among the Institute’s collections.

However, during the last 10 years, *Bibliografia Istorică a României* delegated its mission upon the “Anuarul istoriografic al României” [Historiographical Year-book of Romania], that pursued between 2011 and 2015 the editorial effort by 5 volumes, coordinated by Doru Radosav and published by Argonaut Publishing under the aegis of the “Lucian Blaga” Central University Library from Cluj-Napoca.

Bibliografia Istorică a României, instead, had been published by the Academy’s Publishing House in București, starting with an editorial board formed of Ioachim Crăciun, Ștefan Pascu, Bujor Surdu. The enterprise was continued by coordinators: Andrei Oțetea, George Zane, Constantin C. Giurescu, Cornelia Bodea, Marina Vlasiu, Vladimir Diculescu; authors: Ioachim Crăciun, Gheorghe Hristodol, Marcel Știrban, Ludovic Báthory, Gheorghe Iancu, Gelu Neamțu, Gheorghe Dumitrașcu, Adrian Andrei Rusu, Nicolae Păun, Stelian Mândruț, Ioan Nistor, Ludovic Báthory, Felicia Hristodol, Simona Nicoară, Lucia Turc, Magdalena Tampa, Ottmar Trașcă, Varga Attila, Veronica Turcuș, Vasile Ciobanu, Aurora Arion, Mihaela Bedecanu, Mircea Birț, Monica-Gabriela Culic, and collaborators: Teodor Bugnariu, Ioan Domșa, Jordáky Lajos, Mariana Pascu-Toader, George Cipăianu, Maria Maxim, Ioan Bratu, Ileana Bozac, Ion Bozdoc, Teodor Bugnariu, Ion Cicală, Csetri András, Ioan Domșa, Eged Ákos, Kurt Horedt, Károly Demeter, Kovács János, G.Em. While the two volumes edited by Nicolae Edroiu lay the groundwork of our institution's history, offering for the first time a systematic approach of the 90 years old history of the Cluj Institute, *Bibliografia* elaborated by Veronica Turcuș, Felicia and Gheorghe Hristodol represents a valuable historiographic tool for larger categories of users.

18. *Dicționarul Membrilor Institutului de Istorie din Cluj (1920–2020)* [Dictionary of the Members of the Institute of History in Cluj (1920–2020)], 1 vol., 2020. It is an enterprise of high scientific, editorial and graphic standing, edited and coordinated by Mara Mărginean, Mirela Popa-Andrei and Attila Varga. Colleagues from all three currently existing history institutes of the Cluj Branch of the Romanian Academy have collaborated to this project's accomplishment, in the first place the Institute "George Barițiu", then the Center for Transylvanian Studies and, last but not least, the Institute of Archaeology and Art History. Such a prodigious dictionary, realized on the occasion of hundred years since our Institute's

foundation, is indeed very difficult to be iterated; its new edition may take another hundred years, probably preparing the anniversary of the Institute's bicentenary.

19. *Biblioteca Institutului de Istorie Națională* [Library of the Institute of National History], 22 vol., 1928–1948. The collection was founded at the initiative of the first two directors of the Institute of National History in Cluj, Ioan Lupaș and Alexandru Lapedatu, who understood the need to publish under the institutional aegis independent monographs, whose sizes exceeded the limited frames offered by pages of the Institute's "Anuar" [Yearbook]. From the 22 volumes of *Biblioteca Institutului de Istorie Națională* published for two decades in the interwar period, two thirds, that is 15 volumes, were issued between the years 1942–1948. Among the latter also count the doctoral theses (that had to be published before the delivery at that moment) written by Ioachim Crăciun, Ioan Moga, Aurel Decei, David Prodan, Ștefan Pascu, Rolf Kutschera, Helmut Klima, Mihail P. Dan, considered to be true works of reference until today.³⁷

20. *Biblioteca Institutului de Istorie Cluj. Serie nouă* [Library of the History Institute Cluj. New Series], 10 vol., 1994–2008. The new series of *Biblioteca Institutului de Istorie Cluj* includes volumes of studies, monographs and documents of high quality, belonging to the new generation of researchers from our Institute during the post-1989 years, experts in medieval history (Aurel Răduțiu, Susana Andea, Lidia Gross, Vasile Rus, Adinel Dincă), premodern history (Remus Câmpeanu, Anton Dörner), modern history (Simion Retegan, Dumitru Suciuc, Camil Mureșanu, Ioan Bolovan, Daniela Deteșan, Attila Varga, Mirela Popa-Andrei) and contemporary history (George Cipăianu, Veronica Turcuș). This series of 10 volumes does not have a collection cover (like the other collections of our Institute), as the authors have published their volumes mostly on their own.³⁸

21. Collection of *Teze de doctorat* [Doctoral Theses], 27 vol., 2010–2020. After the year 2000, when it was acknowledged as an institution organizing doctorates (IOD), the "George Barițiu" Institute of History in Cluj-Napoca has granted not only PhDs in medieval, modern and contemporary history of Romania, as well as in the history of culture, but also the possibility was offered to the new doctors to publish their doctoral dissertations in the collection *Teze de doctorat*. Since 2010 until 2015 in this collection there were published 15 volumes, and until 2020 27 volumes.³⁹

Because the new doctors support at their own expense the publication of the doctoral dissertations, the collection *Teze de doctorat* doesn't have a series cover

either, its name being registered only on the cover pages, by also mentioning the number of the published volumes.

22. Collection of *Biografii istorice transilvane (BIT)*, [Transylvanian Historical Biographies], 18 vol., 2006–2021. In 2006, the volume of studies entitled *Biografii pașoptiste* [1]. *Culegere de studii* [Biographies of Fortyeighters. Collection of studies], coordinated by Gelu Neamțu, was published in what was to become the future “green collection” of *Biografii Istorice Transilvane*, coordinated by Gelu Neamțu (2008–2011) and Ela Cosma (since 2011), the series cover being realized by Adriana Bogdan. In 2011, the collection has also been officially transferred from the Publishing House of the Romanian Academy in București to Argonaut Publishing in Cluj-Napoca. Since 2013, when the Canadian Symphologic Publishing joined us within this collection, both mentioned publishing houses have managed together to ensure a more efficient editorial policy and a more fluent dissemination process of the published volumes. The budget, necessary for the publication of the generally massive volumes of the *BIT* collection, was supported by the publishing houses (Editura Academiei, 4 vol., 2006–2009; Editura Argonaut, 2 vol., 2011, 1 vol., 2014, 1 vol., 2020), authors (1 vol., 2012), sponsors (1 vol., 2021) or it was supported by the grants PNII-ID-PCE-2011-3-0064 (7 vol., 2013–2019) and GAR-UM-2019-II-2.5-13 (1 vol., 2020), led by Ela Cosma.

18 tomes of this series have been published up to now, from tome 0 (2006) and tome I (2008) to tome XVII (2021). By publishing under the aegis of the Romanian Academy and of the “George Barițiu” Institute of History volumes of studies, monographs, dictionaries of historical biographies, multilingual critical editions in various modern languages and languages of the documents, *Biografii istorice transilvane* counts among the recognized collections promoted by our Institute.

*

“Encomiastical papers” (Ioan Bolovan), as those delivered on anniversary occasions or those reflecting institutional history (the present article included), might easily be seen and criticized as simple (and boring) “inventories” of names and achievements (Ioan Lumperdean).⁴⁰ Yet they are real and complete *inventory assets* (current, capital and intangible assets) accomplished by the celebrated institution, in order to capitalize its tangible and intangible patrimony. Such is the case of the “George Barițiu” Institute of History in Cluj-Napoca, that celebrated

last year its centennial birthday. Our Institute's 22 collections presenting critical document editions, monographs and studies, bibliographies, glossaries and dictionaries (leaving aside the 2 collections of periodical publications), together with the human capital created by the collections' editors and authors represent nothing less than the essence of our Institute's existence, its very material and spiritual heritage to be carried on and fructified in the *longue durée* forever.

Finally, we attach to the present article the complete bibliography of the collections published over the course of a century by the Institute of History in Cluj. Even if its existence was so tumultuous on political and institutional level, nevertheless on professional level it was unceasingly dedicated to the restitution of historical documents and to the editing of the documentary heritage.
